

Findlay woman arraigned on drug charges

A December drug raid on Findlay's Harrington Avenue has resulted in four drug charges being filed against the property owner.

Rosemary A. Siefer, 46, 138 Harrington Ave., appeared for arraignment Wednesday in Hancock County Common Pleas Court on three possession of drugs charges and one trafficking in drugs charge. She entered innocent pleas and was released on her own recognizance .

A Feb. 25 pretrial hearing was scheduled.

Siefer was indicted last week by a Hancock County grand jury in connection with a Dec. 22 raid conducted by the METRICH drug task force, and a November drug deal that authorities say was made at the home.

During the December raid, officers seized crack cocaine, powder cocaine and Oxycodone, a prescription pain killer. The drug trafficking offense allegedly occurred Nov. 14 and involved crack.

The charges range from a first-degree felony, the most serious, to a fifth-degree felony, the least serious. Each count contained a specification that the property is subject to forfeiture under Ohio law because the drug transactions occurred there.

A warranty deed filed with the indictment shows Siefer, who was formerly known as Rosemary A. Kingery, to be the current owner of the property.

Also arraigned Wednesday were David W. Beasley, 43, 2611 N. Main St., and Delia L. Miracle, 30, 119 Stanley Ave.

Beasley pleaded innocent to two counts of trafficking in marijuana, one fifth-degree and one fourth-degree felony. His bond was established at \$11,250 and a Feb. 25 pretrial hearing date was scheduled.

Beasley is alleged to have sold less than 200 grams of marijuana on Aug. 1 and Aug. 13. The latter offense is considered more serious because it occurred within 1,000 feet of Northview School.

Miracle entered innocent pleas to two counts of trafficking in cocaine, both fourth-degree felonies. She was released on her own recognizance. The case is scheduled for pretrial Feb. 27.

According to her indictment, Miracle sold less than five grams of cocaine within 1,000 feet of Washington School on Aug. 8 and within 1,000 feet of Northview School on Aug. 13.

The indictments against Siefer, Beasley and Miracle were filed Feb. 5, but had remained sealed until the defendants were located earlier this week.
